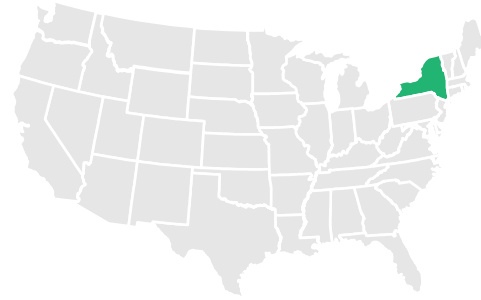

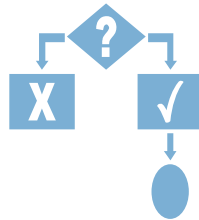

Identify the values, behaviors, and cultural norms to follow

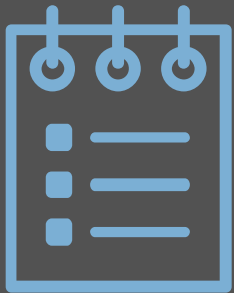

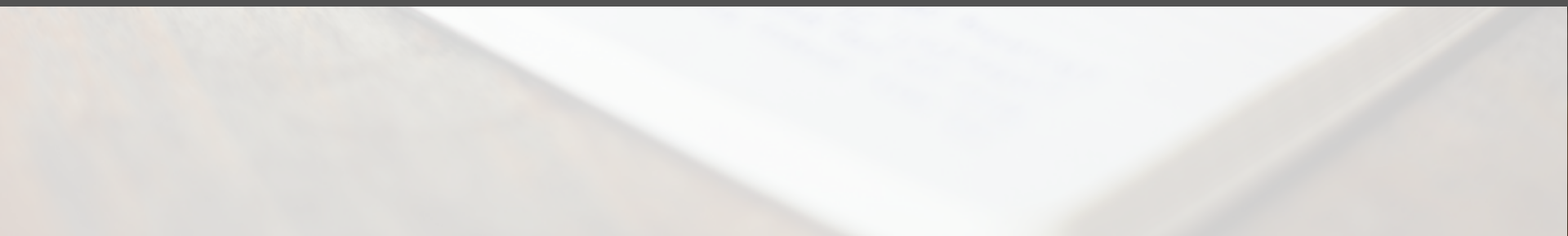

	Internship Tip	Definition
1	Hit The Ground Running	Prepare so you when you start your internship you can move fast
2	Determine what success looks like	Take the time to define and understand how you'll be measured, define your own set of measurements
3	Add Value Early and Often	Use your strengths to contribute immediately
4	Learn What The Culture Values	Speak to other interns about the culture. Start asking around for names of people who are successful at the company
5	Build Authentic Relationships	Connect with others through contributions and mutual interests
6	Keep Track Of what You Do	Develop a "learning book" to catalogue your lessons and key takeaways
7	Be Indispensable	Leave your mark on the people and company
